

Bradley Jackson maintains a contract lobbying practice representing clients before the Tennessee General Assembly and Executive branch. Jackson previously served as the President and CEO of the Tennessee Chamber of Commerce & Industry and the Tennessee Manufacturers Association for 20 years. Prior to serving as CEO of the State Chamber, Jackson served as the Chamber's Vice President for Government Relations and Community Affairs leading all aspects of the Chamber's lobbying and outreach efforts beginning in 2007. Jackson has an extensive policy and legislative background and relationships and has successfully lobbied some of Tennessee's most prominent legislative initiatives on behalf of the business community including tort reform (2014), workers compensation reform (2017), overhaul and reduction of Franchise and Excise taxes (2017/2024) workforce and education initiatives and infrastructure and economic development initiatives and successfully worked to defeat anti business legislation that if enacted would have harmed Tennessee employers.

Jackson began his career in the State Legislature as a research analyst for the Senate and House Finance Committees. His next role shifted to the executive branch where he headed up legislative operations for the Tennessee Department of Financial Institutions and then later in the Governor's office, he managed the implementation of various state government policy and legislative initiatives and external relationships across the state. Bradley has a strong working relationship with business leaders and elected officials across the state and has experience in developing effective strategies to successfully shepherd initiatives through the General Assembly as well as association management.
