



Howard Wall Bio

Howard Wall is the director and chief economist of the Center for Regional Economic Research at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. He is also a professor of practice in the Department of Finance and Economics, in UTC's Gary W. Rollins College of Business.

Before joining UTC, Dr. Wall was a professor of economics and director of the Center for Applied Economics at Lindenwood University in St. Charles, Missouri. Prior to that, he spent 12 years at the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, where he was a vice president and regional economics adviser. At the St. Louis Fed, he was responsible for briefing the bank president and others on local economic conditions, coordinating the St. Louis Fed's Beige Book, and drafting speeches for the bank president.

Before his time with the Federal Reserve, Dr. Wall taught economics at West Virginia University and Birkbeck College, University of London. He is a native of upstate New York and received his B.A. from the State University of New York at Binghamton and his M.A and Ph.D. from the State University of New York at Buffalo.
